SECRET HISTORY™: THE WILD WEST TO BROADCAST IN CANADA ON APTN

The new docudrama series premieres **Feb. 11, 2021 in Blackfoot** and **Feb. 13, 2021 in English**

CALGARY, Alberta Jan. 14, 2021

HERD of 1 MEDIA's new half-hour x 13-episode docudrama series **SECRET HISTORY™: THE WILD WEST** is premiering on Canada's national Indigenous network APTN. The first season, "The Wild West", explores the mystical and metaphysical influences behind Western Canada's most notorious Indigenous heroes and villains that shaped the Canadian West.

Secret History™ series takes a fresh approach to bring Indigenous history to life in a visually stunning and entertaining way. By utilizing a strategic blend of cinematic live action re-enactments, speaker testimony, animation and archive photos, the series unearths the past to shine a light on historical First Nations, Inuit and Metis icons that Canadian history overlooks or have forgotten.

Join the show's host, the Trickster as played by Julian Black Antelope (*Hold the Dark, Tribal, Blackstone*) as he guides the viewer through each half hour episode to uncover and rediscover the *Secret History* – of 13 notable indigenous individuals who played an extraordinary part in shaping the Canadian *Wild West*. Tune in each week to learn the mysterious influences behind the likes of *Jerry Potts, Calf Shirt, Red Crow, Poundmaker, Louis Riel* and many more. Showcasing a talented cast of Indigenous guest stars in each episode, filming locations for this series include Bow River Ranch in Calgary, Alta and Fort Whoop-Up in Lethbridge, Alta.

The **Secret History™** series Creator, Showrunner, Writer and creative driving force Julian Black Antelope, applies his feature film producing skills and the tropes of a variety of genre conventions into his first television series endeavor.

"I grew up hearing about some of these people and their stories but wondered why there was very little information taught about them in school, so my goal with this project was to fill in the gaps and bring a seldom seen point of view through an Indigenous lens." says Julian Black Antelope. *The Secret History series also has a Blackfoot language version, which like the show itself, is something long overdue. I believe language and cultural preservation are absolutely vital, especially in this day and age, so for myself it's an especially rewarding experience to see all the time it's taken, hard work and research come to fruition".*

Told from an Indigenous perspective, every episode of **Secret History™: The Wild West** is anchored by testimony from direct descendants, spiritual leaders and tribal elders of both *Siksikaitsitapi* (Blackfoot) and *Nehiyaw-Pwat* (Cree) Confederacy's.

"This series challenges the often skewed and one-sided historical perspectives of Indigenous Peoples," said Black Antelope. *"The series' intention is to educate the historical and contemporary contributions of our Peoples: not to throw a proverbial brick through history's window, but instead open the door to let some fresh air in."*

Secret History™: The Wild West is produced by Julian Black Antelope, Lars Lehmann and Laurie Venning. Directors for the season include a variety of Indigenous and non-Indigenous guest directors including directorial debuts from Berkley Brady and Julian Black Antelope.
